### Appendix (iii)

#### **Best Practice - I**

- 1. Title of the practice: Book Review
- Goal: To enhance students' literary competence Objectives:
  - i. To inculcate the habit of reading books.
  - ii. To develop the critical insight of the students.
- 3. The Context:

It has been observed that the students are going away from books. They are seeking information either from electronic media or from e-sources. As the college is located in the rural area, students have no exposure to the library resource. Hence, the necessity of this kind of practice.

4. The practice:

This activity was conducted by the department of Marathi.At first, the students were informed about the concept of book review. They were asked to read some samples of book reviews fro, different magazines and news papers. Specific books were selected. The books were circulated among the students. In the next meeting, students discussed the different aspects of the books they had read. Then they were asked to write the review of the book they had read.

- 5. Evidence of success:
- It has been observed that students asked the concerned teacher to recommend some other books for reading.
  - 6. Problem encountered:

Students are eager to read the books, but unwilling to write a review.

#### **Best Practice - II**

- 1. Title of the practice: Preparing Research Project
- Goal: To make students aware about the historical documentation.
   Objectives:
  - To inculcate the historical awareness about the regional issues.
  - To make students aware about the process of preparing a research project.
- 3. The context:

The undergraduate students lack the knowledge about the actual research activity. Being located in a rural area becomes a major hindrance for them. Similarly, the place where the college is located has dense historical associations.

4. The practice:

The department of History conducted this activity. At the beginning of the academic year a group of students is selected. They were asked to collect the regional history from library. Then they were taken to specific places where they saw historical buildings/monuments. Students talked with the villagers; collected the data.

Then students were told about process of preparing a project report. Finally they were asked to submit their reports.

5. Evidence of success:

Students love the activity of visiting places, interviewing the villagers and preparing a report.

6. Problems encountered: It becomes difficult to take the group to the remote places, particularly the girl students.
