Best Practice - I

- Title of the practice: Our Festivals and Environment Concerns
- 1. Context: Indian social life is full of festivals. In case of Maharashtra, Ganesh festival is a major festival. As per the custom, after five days the idols of lord Ganesh and the remains of an offering are immersed in the rivers. It has been observed that due to the chemical colours and the remains, the river water is polluted, the fish in the water die. So it becomes necessary to make people aware about these environmental issues.

2. Objectives:

- i) To make students aware about the environmental concerns due to immersion of the idols of lord Ganesha in rivers.
- ii) To persuade the villagers to donate the idols to social organizations and not to throw remains in rivers.
- 3. The practice: This activity was carried away by the NSS unit of the college. Through regular activities of NSS, the students were oriented towards the idea of donating the idols of Lord Ganesha. On 31st August the students went to the nearby lakes and river places. At the time of

- immersion, they tried to convince the villagers and appealed them to donate the idols.
- 4. Evidence of success: Around 2500 Ganesh idols were donated by the villagers.
- 5. Problem encountered:(i) Problem of convincing the villagers

Best Practice - II

- 1. Title of the practice: Training in using MS Excel
- 2. The context: Using the tools of MS Office has become an indispensible part of the academic and corporate life. It has been observed that students, particularly the Commerce students are unaware of the use of MS Excel. Therefore, it becomes necessary to give exposure to the students in that direction.
- 3. Objectives:
 - To make students aware about the use of technology.
 - To make students aware about use of MS Excel.
- 4. The practice: The department of Commerce conducted this activity. The activity was conducted for the B. Com. students. Every day, from 11.15 am to 12.15 pm from 18/12/2017 to 26/12/2017 the lectures and practise sessions were conducted for the students. The lectures were conducted in the seminar hall and the practical were conducted in the computer lab. The course included the topics such as the concept of Excel sheet, preparing Excel sheets, etc.
- 5. Evidence of success: 19 students benefitted from the course.
